



## TRANSPORTATION OF ESSENTIAL GOODS

The transportation of essential goods is permitted from warehousing sites to essential service providers.

Cargo may be moved from ports of entry to warehousing sites where handling and clearing of cargo is conducted. With the exception of the transportation of liquor; cargo may be transported to ports of entry for purposes of exporting.

## REGULATION ON THE SUPPLY OF ENERGY AND PETROLEUM PRODUCTS



To ensure the continuous supply of energy and petroleum products to the society, a new chapter is inserted in the Regulations so that —

**A**

collieries that supply Eskom shall continue to operate at full capacity

**B**

refineries shall operate at full capacity to avoid shortages of fuel, and such operations shall include refineries, smelters, plants and furnaces.

## AMENDMENTS IN RELATION TO THE MOVEMENT OF CHILDREN DURING LOCKDOWN

The movement of children between co-holders of parental responsibilities and rights or a caregiver remains prohibited during the lockdown period except where arrangements are in place for a child to move from one parent to another, in terms of –

(i) a court order; or (ii) where a parental responsibilities and rights agreement or parenting plan, registered with the family advocate, is in existence:

Provided that there is no person who is known or reasonably suspected to have come into contact with any other person known or reasonably suspected to have contracted COVID-19 in the household which the child has to move to. The parent or caregiver transporting the child concerned must have in his or her possession, the court order or the parental responsibilities and rights agreement or parenting plan.



Stores selling hardware products and vehicle components may open but must maintain a register of persons buying essential goods and must keep a record of a signed declaration, which corresponds substantially with a new form introduced whereby the buyer of goods attests that the goods are essential goods.

### AMENDMENT WITH REGARDS TO CATEGORIES OF STORES PERMITTED TO TRADE

## - HARDWARE STORES

Products to be sold by hardware stores are hardware components and supplies required by any qualified tradespersons solely for the purpose of essential repairs at residential homes and entities engaged in the provision of essential services for any project related to the provision of water, electricity or other essential services.

## AMENDMENTS WITH TO REGARDS TO PERMITS FOR ATTENDANCE OF FUNERALS

A person requesting a permit must produce a death certificate, a certified copy of the death certificate, or a digital copy of the death certificate to the head of court, or a person designated by him or her, or a station commander of a police station or a person designated by him or her.

Where a death certificate is not yet available and the burial or cremation must take place within a period of 24 hours of death in accordance with cultural or religious practices, the person requesting the permit must make a sworn affidavit, supported by a letter from a cultural or religious leader supporting the cultural or religious practice in relation to the burial or cremation.



An attendee/mourner issued with a permit may travel to another metropolitan or district area, or province is allowed to remain in that metropolitan or district area, or province for a period not exceeding **two days**. A person making the arrangements for the funeral, is allowed to remain in that metropolitan or district area, or province for a period not exceeding **six days**.

**The number of persons allowed to attend a funeral remains a maximum of 50.**



## REGULATION OF EVICTIONS

No person may be evicted from their place of residence, regardless of whether it is a formal or informal residence or a farm dwelling for the duration of the lockdown.



## REGULATION ON MINING OPERATIONS

Mining operations, shall be conducted at a reduced capacity of 50% during the period of lockdown, these mines must comply with the following conditions:



- A** A rigorous screening and testing program must be implemented as employees return to work;
- B** The mining industry must provide quarantine facilities for employees who have tested positive for the COVID-19;
- C** Data collected during the screening and testing programme must be submitted to the relevant authority;
- D** Mining companies must make arrangements to transport their employees from their homes to their respective areas of operations;
- E** In accordance with these Regulations and other regulations applicable in neighbouring Southern African Development Community countries, workers from these neighbouring countries will be recalled at the end of lockdown in their respective countries.

The monitoring and impact assessment of seismicity through the Council for Geoscience must be intensified with immediate effect.
