# m. Community Development - Chris Lund and Fran Swart

- i. Homelessness has grown greatly problem city-wide across Johannesburg and all cities
- ii. Exploring concept of an inclusionary neighbourhood
- iii. Cross the Divide NPO overview presented
- iv. Thanks to Pick & Pay for their continuing donations

# n. **Town Planning** – Vacant (Markus Borner presented)

- i. Steve Bayliss, Town Planner, is paid a monthly retainer
- ii. Extremely important to have access to this facility
- iii. Will continue to recruit portfolio holder for longer term
- iv. Question Can all street corners be painted? This can be done street by street, requires budget allocation, or contribution by residents. City permission not required

### o. Infrastructure - Vacant

- i. Need to recruit to fill portfolio
- ii. Improvement in city processes required to address and fix issues potholes remain a major issue, with little progress from the city
- iii. Balance continued trend for urbanisation with capacity to support increased load on infrastructure

# p. Security - Ashleigh Parry

- i. CAP is the CRA contracted Public Space Security (PSS) provider and preferred Armed Response for CRA
- ii. CRA Security sub-committee with direct access to CAP. CAP has direct accountability with an SLA. 5 year agreement signed until 2026
- iii. Signing up with CAP includes Fireops and Medi Response use one number. 1 provider, rather than several providers gives more effective service
- iv. CAP contract is with the CRA committee. It is a confidential bilateral agreement
- v. Note that up until now all CRA members included Fireops, but this will now move to CAP
- vi. Sean Duffy from CAP presented crime overview and thanked the CRA committee for support good working relationship
- vii. Comment Street Rep whatsapp group and separate Domestic workers group. When informing householders of issues, important to let domestic workers know as they are the ones in the houses at all times
